About Our Camps

- **Four-day Weeks** - Camp weeks run Monday through Thursday for families eager to get started on their weekends.
- **EcoArt Fridays** - We are once again reserving Friday mornings for special mini-camps with a nature and art emphasis.
- **More Sessions for Young Campers** - Great half-day camps are the perfect experience for our youngest campers, ages 3, 4 or 5.
- **Small Group Sizes** - Care and attention is given to each camper. At least one professional naturalist and volunteer naturalists guide our camps.

Registration

Early registration is encouraged. Space is limited and camps fill quickly! You can register for one week or as many as you like. Each week highlights a different theme and offers a wide range of activities.

Registration begins **Tuesday, March 2nd at 9:00 a.m.**, taken on a first-come, first-served basis. The deadline for registration is two weeks prior to the start of each camp or until class is full. Register in one of four ways:

A confirmation letter will be mailed prior to camp. Additional information detailing what to bring, wear and other important information will be included.

Cancellations and Refunds

- Registration fee will be refunded, minus a \$25 processing fee if cancellation is at least 30 days prior to start of camp.

- If Tamarack Nature Center must cancel a camp, a full refund will be issued.
