Ramsey/Washington Counties Preliminary Public Collection Framework

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1. Introduction

Ramsey and Washington Counties (Counties) are conducting this study of Public Collection to determine if each county should change the overall approach to collection and management of solid wastes in their county in order to meet the goals of their Solid Waste Management Plans. These goals are aimed at ensuring that solid waste management protects public health, safety and the environment.

The purpose of this report is to present a preliminary framework of how Public Collection could look in order to facilitate the ongoing discussion and to gain additional input from stakeholders in each county. While this report lays out certain concepts, it is critical to point out that no decisions have been made regarding Public Collection. The concepts covered simply provide a framework for continued discussion.

2. Vision and Context of Public Collection

Minnesota Statute 473.803 requires metropolitan counties to plan and implement activities to meet the State's policy for solid waste management. Overall, local governments are responsible for ensuring that solid waste generated in their jurisdictions is managed in an environmentally and economically sound manner that protects public health and safety. Solid waste management is strongly grounded in the need to safeguard the environment, conserve and recover material and energy resources, and protect public health and safety. Thus, counties are accountable to the public they serve to successfully plan and implement activities to meet the state policy and the corresponding goals established in the solid waste management plans.

Ramsey and Washington Counties embrace this vision, accept their role, and desire to step forward in a responsible manner. The Counties' vision includes working very closely with private service providers in "Public/Private Partnerships" to undertake activities designed to implement state policy.

Both Counties have adopted solid waste master plans, which were prepared jointly with other metropolitan counties and have been approved by the State of Minnesota. These plans establish outcomes, policies, and strategies to meet goals established in the State's Regional Solid Waste Policy Plan.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this Public Collection project would be to utilize the authorities of Minnesota counties to develop the structure and mechanisms in Ramsey and Washington Counties to carry out the Counties' role to:

- ◆ Implement State policy;
- ◆ Meet environmental goals;
- ◆ Protect public health and safety;
- ◆ Conserve resources;
- ◆ Reduce/minimize long-term liability;

- ◆ Link generators of waste directly to their responsibility; and
- ◆ Ensure continued private sector competition for cost-effective services.

4. Solid Waste Management Plan Goals

The Counties' Solid Waste Management Plans (Plans) are founded in a regional vision for a sustainable community that seeks to minimize waste, prevent pollution, promote efficiency, and provide a sustainable infrastructure for solid waste management. These goals seek to protect the environment, public health, and safety. The goals are aimed at conserving energy and resources. A key goal is to protect the state's land, air, water, other natural resources, and the public health through an integrated system, in which waste is managed using a variety of technologies. The State has a hierarchy of preferred waste management methods, which is important to attain the objectives of sustainability and appropriate solid waste management.

There are five goals inherent in the vision of sustainability that provide the basis for the desired results from activities in the Solid Waste Management Plan. These include:

- ◆ Manage wastes to protect the environment and public health, and to conserve resources;
- ◆ Manage wastes using a variety of methods according to the State's hierarchy, in order to minimize landfilling;
- ◆ Manage wastes cost-effectively and minimize potential liability for citizens, businesses, and taxpayers;
- ◆ Encourage waste generator responsibility for environmentally sound waste management; and
- ◆ Allocate costs fairly to users.

The Plans for each county have specific outcomes and strategies related to each level of the solid waste hierarchy, including:

- ◆ Source reduction;
- ◆ Toxicity reduction;
- ◆ Recycling;
- ◆ Resource recovery and composting; and
- ◆ Landfilling.

5. Specific Problems in the Current System

Several problems with the current solid waste management system have been identified by the Counties.

- ◆ **Waste generation is increasing rapidly**—the amount of solid waste generated each year has been increasing much faster than population growth. In Ramsey

and Washington Counties, the waste stream has grown over 18 percent from 1996 through 2000 versus a population growth of 5 percent over the same time period. This is in direct conflict with goals for source reduction.

- ◆ **Recycling is stagnant or decreasing as economic incentives to recycle have diminished.** While there is considerable recycling, it has leveled off and is not keeping pace with the growth in the waste stream. The diminished economic incentive has resulted from significantly lower tipping fees combined with lower material market prices.
- ◆ **Resources that could be put to a higher use are disposed in processing facilities or landfills.** Waste composition studies show that almost half (45%) of the material collected as mixed municipal solid waste could be recycled, and about 70% could be used in organics composting facilities.
- ◆ **Key decisions are made with a focus on short-term cost or profits.** Decisions based on short-term costs or profits are not balanced with longer term costs and benefits for conserving resources and minimizing the generator's potential future liability.
- ◆ **Illegal dumping of wastes and associated environmental concerns continues in several areas.** Public officials in St. Paul and Ramsey County, as well as several cities in Washington County, note illegal dumping is currently a significant problem.
- ◆ **Municipal concerns on truck traffic continue.** Several municipal officials raise questions regarding the potential impacts of garbage truck traffic such as safety, excess road wear, and aesthetics (noise and dust).
- ◆ **Resource recovery costs are subsidized to compete with landfilling costs.** The subsidies are raised on county property tax statements and state taxes on solid waste. Property tax service charges are not tied closely to waste generation. Therefore costs for resource recovery are not allocated fairly to users based on the quantity of waste they generate.
- ◆ **Resource Recovery capacity is not consistently utilized.** For the past several years, significant quantities of wastes that could be recovered to produce energy have been landfilled. In 2002, waste deliveries to resource recovery are projected to be in excess of capacity—a very significant change in waste quantities that currently will only last one year. There has been no ability to plan for efficient management of capacity. In addition:
 - Resources are being disposed in landfills;
 - Waste stream growth is being managed at the low end of the hierarchy; and
 - Increased landfilling creates the potential for long term clean up needs.

Ramsey and Washington Counties are evaluating Public Collection to determine whether expanding public contracting for collection service can address these problems and help meet the goals of the Solid Waste Management Plans.

6. Critical Values/Concerns from Preliminary Input

The Counties have sought preliminary comments from several key stakeholders as part of the initial discussion of Public Collection. Comments have been received from:

- ◆ Municipal officials;
- ◆ Community organizations;
- ◆ Waste haulers;
- ◆ Waste management facility owners;
- ◆ Environmental groups;
- ◆ Citizens; and
- ◆ Businesses.

While the Counties will continue to seek input, there are several key values and/or concerns stated by stakeholders that have been taken into consideration in developing this preliminary framework. These critical values or concerns are described below.

6.1 Values

In the first phase of the Counties' evaluation of public collection, people were asked to provide input on public collection, prior to much background or discussion about the concept. Table 1 lists the values identified during these preliminary discussions and surveys. Maintaining competition in the collection industry is important in all areas. Using wastes as resources is also a strong value with broad support.

Table 1

Values

Value
◆ Maintaining competition in the hauling industry is a strong value in all areas.
◆ Using waste as a resource such as recovering material value through recycling, recovering energy from waste, and composting organics is an important value.
◆ Preserving small haulers is a strong value
◆ Freedom of choice of hauler is a strong value for residents in some municipalities.
◆ Minimizing displacement of small haulers and maintaining existing haulers is critical for some residents.
◆ Reducing the negative impacts from collection truck traffic is important to some residents.
◆ Assuring reasonable cost of service
◆ Quality of service
◆ Wisely using public resources

Loyalty to haulers (particularly small companies) is a fairly widespread value and there are some communities wherein maintaining a choice to select their hauler is indicated to be very important.

During the summer of 2001 the Solid Waste Management Coordinating Board retained the Jefferson Center to conduct a “Citizens Jury” on solid waste management in the metropolitan area. After an intense week of study, the Citizens Jury adopted a set of values that they believe are important as the metropolitan area looks forward to the long term of waste management. The values identified by the Citizens Jury in order of preference are shown in Table 2.

**Table 2
Citizen Jury Values**

Keeping both short-term and long-term planning in mind, the preferred solid waste management strategy for the metropolitan area should:

- ◆ Promote and protect optimum **health and safety**;
 - ◆ Aggressively foster and encourage **responsibility** at multiple levels (personal, corporate, government);
 - ◆ Protect, preserve and enhance the **environment**;
 - ◆ Support and provide a sound **economic value**;
 - ◆ Maximize operational **efficiency**; and
 - ◆ Be as **convenient** as possible.

6.2 Concerns

Table 3 lists major concerns raised by the public during the first phase, according to some common groupings, including:

- ◆ Maintaining competition
- ◆ Cost
- ◆ Service quality issues
- ◆ Environmental goals and community impacts
- ◆ Hauler issues

Table 3

Major Concerns Identified

The following major concerns were identified, some of which are in conflict or tension with others.

Maintain Competition:

- ◆ It is important to maintain independent disposal sites (i.e., not owned by hauling companies) for independent haulers—including processing facilities, recycling facilities, and landfills.
- ◆ The plan should provide a level playing field for all haulers, in the form of consistent disposal standards and fees for all haulers.
- ◆ It is important to maintain independent, local hauling companies.
- ◆ Using a public bidding process provides an advantage to large companies.
- ◆ Assigning areas to haulers will ensure value of the business and create an incentive to sell sooner.

Cost:

- ◆ Cost is an important factor.
- ◆ The design should keep administrative costs low.
- ◆ Putting “stops” closer together can reduce a haulers’ costs.
- ◆ Increased garbage fees to generators could cause an increase in illegal dumping and bad debt.
- ◆ Increasing garbage fees to waste generators for trash pick up will create more of an incentive to recycle and reduce.
- ◆ Residents and businesses should pay as directly as possible for service.
- ◆ Residents will end up paying more state tax if garbage fees increase.

Service Quality Issues:

- ◆ It is important to maintain quality service, including timely service, clean pick-ups, recycling service, price clarity, and ability to contact haulers via telephone.
- ◆ There is no convenient brush collection service in many communities.
- ◆ There is a need to address collection of certain problem materials, such as sharps and some household hazardous wastes, in service contracts.
- ◆ Hauler consolidation is resulting in decreasing service satisfaction (early start time, late end time, missed pick-ups, speeding, driving on wrong side).
- ◆ Neighborhoods want a choice in who hauls in a zone so they can switch if service is poor.

Goals:

- ◆ **Environmental**
 - Design the system to promote recycling; consider this to be collection of resources, not waste
 - Reduce and properly handle illegal dumping and reduce open burn barrels.
 - Provide haulers with an incentive to recycle.
 - ◆ **Reduce Community Impacts**
 - There is more truck traffic associated with multiple haulers.
 - Noise, especially from early morning pick-ups.
 - ◆ Require mandatory collection with an opportunity for variance.
 - ◆ Design for more uniform service for multi-family residential.

Hauler Issues:

- ◆ Allow haulers to maintain the value of their company.
 - ◆ Maintain opportunities for growth in hauling business.
 - ◆ Different residential areas have different waste generation quantities (more weight per stop in some areas).
 - ◆ Don't create zones by day-of-week collection that causes a hauler to be unable to service all accounts in the zone in a day.
 - ◆ Recycling funding in open, competitive markets is inadequate to cover hauler's costs.
 - ◆ Haulers do not want to have to bid or compete in a procurement process to keep business that they already have

7. Preliminary Draft Structure

7.1 Introduction

Solid waste, once generated, has an affect on public health and the environment no matter how it is managed. The degree of impact varies with the management method. Proper management of solid waste is a necessary public service. Local governments are responsible for solid waste management within their jurisdictions. Therefore, counties such as Ramsey and Washington Counties have authority to adopt ordinances to provide collection of solid wastes as an essential public service.

It is important to understand that Public Collection is not a new concept in the Counties. For example, several municipalities already contract for residential collection service. Many municipalities have a single contractor for residential recycling collection. The Counties provide household hazardous waste collection service. There are several county or municipal yard waste collection points. Thus, there is already significant experience with the concept in the Counties.

In keeping with the value of Public/Private Partnerships, in a public collection system the Counties would contract with private companies to provide the required services. The Counties' decisions on the types of services required will be guided by the goals in the Solid Waste Management Plans.

There are several aspects that are fundamental to the structure of a Public Collection System. The basic aspects include the following:

- ◆ Identification of services to be covered and the features of the services
- ◆ Consideration of the number of haulers per zone that maintains healthy competition on a countywide basis
- ◆ Service procurement options and contracts
- ◆ Funding and payment methods

The following section of the framework describes these key aspects and options to be considered. *The framework is written as a plan; bear in mind that no decision on public collection has been made by the Counties. This framework is suggested as a description of how it could be implemented, and therefore reads as a plan.*

7.2 Services

7.2.1 Services to be Provided

This framework addresses services for collection for both single-family and multi-family residential generators and collection from commercial (including commercial, industrial and institutional) businesses. Multi-family residential typically includes more than four residential units. Waste types addressed by this framework for collection include:

- ◆ Municipal solid waste (MSW);
- ◆ Recyclables;
- ◆ Yard wastes, which includes leaves, grass clippings and soft-bodied yard waste;
- ◆ Brush, which includes woody material from routine yard work, but not waste from disasters;
- ◆ Bulky wastes such as furniture, mattresses, or other large items;
- ◆ Source-separated organic wastes such as food wastes and non-recyclable papers; and
- ◆ Household hazardous wastes (HHW).

7.2.2 Service Delivery

The Counties intend to contract with private companies to provide the required services. (Note: county trucks and crews are a legal option for the Counties and therefore could be listed in an ordinance but have been eliminated from discussion in this framework.)

Collection service will be mandatory for all generators, including residences, institutions, and businesses, but there will be variance procedures available for those who desire to otherwise manage their waste in an environmentally sound manner. Examples of this are combined collection with neighbors or relatives or self-haulers of waste. Those requesting variances will have written documentation and the alternative management methods must meet environmental standards.

Some municipalities in each county have organized their residential MSW collection and/or residential recyclables collection. The Counties anticipate these municipalities would continue their current service system for those organized approaches. If the city desires to no longer be involved in collection, the city could transfer the responsibility to the county.

To address illegal dumping, the Counties will assure that community clean-up events are conveniently and regularly provided throughout in the county (existing municipal events may continue if desired). The Counties will also evaluate whether any change in the current response to illegal dumping, including investigation and enforcement, is needed.

To address toxicity reduction, the Counties will continue in their mandated roles to regulate the commercial generation of hazardous waste. For household hazardous waste, the Counties may pursue expanded collection of household hazardous wastes via:

- ◆ Expanding county-sponsored collection availability;
- ◆ Expanded on-call collection; and
- ◆ A pilot curbside collection program.

7.2.3 Service Zones

Service zones are geographic areas in which collection services are provided by private haulers under contract to the county. Service zones will vary for three different types of waste streams (i.e., single-family residential, multi-family residential, and commercial). Service zones may also vary for different material types (i.e., a residential zone for MSW may be different than residential recyclables). Each zone will have one or more haulers under contract to provide the specific service for that zone.

For single-family residential service, zones are proposed to be based on municipal boundaries. Market share and/or a specific zone's route size may be used to specify a zone(s) as a service area for a specific contractor. Some municipalities may be divided into several zones. For example, this framework suggests that St. Paul be divided into 17 zones for residential MSW collection based upon the 17 planning districts. If the preference is for communities to be combined, a service zone could consist of more than one municipality.

For commercial service, it is anticipated that zones would be based on municipal or countywide boundaries.

For multi-family residential, zones may typically be tied to commercial zones. In some instances, existing municipal organized collection systems include multi-family residential with contracted single-family residential service (for either MSW or recyclables). These systems are proposed to remain unchanged provided the municipality's contracts assure the proposed service standards are met.

7.2.4 Service Standards

To help progress toward source reduction, toxicity reduction, and recycling goals, the Counties desire to set some standards for certain services that are known to improve reduction and recycling or will create incentives to promote those results.

Attached to this framework in Appendix A is a detailed outline of service standards that could be included in any implementation of public collection. These standards are the expectations for various services. In some cases these would be included in an ordinance, in others in vendor contracts.

The service standards presented in this framework are included for discussion.

Service standards have been developed for the following:

- ◆ Residential service
 - MSW collection
 - Recyclables collection
- ◆ Commercial service
 - MSW collection
 - Recyclables collection
- ◆ Multi-family housing; manufactured home parks
 - MSW collection
 - Recyclables collection
- ◆ Other services
 - Residential toxicity reduction
 - Problem materials
 - Yard waste/organics/tree waste

7.3 Number of Haulers Per Zone

There is a wide variation in the values and concerns expressed by the public related to the number of haulers (i.e., contractors) to provide service in a zone. There is a range from the strong value to maintain choice of haulers to strong concerns to reduce truck traffic and have only one hauler.

As noted, the Counties anticipate establishing zones for different types of service and that the boundaries of the zones and approaches within each zone can have some flexibility. There will be variations among single-family residential, multi-family residential, and commercial service.

7.3.1 Single-Family Residential Service

It is anticipated that the zone boundaries would be based on municipal borders. The Counties anticipate that the “extent of single-family residential organization” should reflect the community’s preference. Options include:

- ◆ Stay the same—whether a single hauler or multiple haulers (i.e., choice);
- ◆ Change to a single hauler; or
- ◆ Stay with multiple haulers (choice) but reduce the number.

The Counties will seek additional input from municipal officials as part of the second phase of this preliminary study.

If there is no clear preference provided by a community, the county would implement in a manner meeting the county Solid Waste Management Plan goals.

7.3.2 Commercial Service

The zone boundaries are anticipated to be much larger than single-family residential and could be based on groupings of municipalities or even countywide zones. Commercial service delivery structure is anticipated to be via multiple hauler contracts. This could be open to any hauler that meets the commercial service standards and county contracting requirements. This is anticipated to help maintain healthy competition for commercial waste collection services.

7.3.3 Multi-Family Residential Service

Multi-family service is currently typically provided with the trucks used for commercial collection. In most instances, multi-family residential service zones and contract approaches will mirror the commercial collection zones and contractors. There are some existing municipal residential contracts that include multi-family with the single-family service. These would be maintained provided the service standards are met.

7.4 Procurement Options

There are basic options that can be used by the Counties. These include:

- ◆ Directly negotiate contracts with the hauler(s) currently servicing the area
- ◆ Request for proposals (RFP) with multiple selection criteria such as:
 - Customer service
 - Experience
 - Ability to provide requested services
 - Regulatory compliance history
 - Cost

While the Counties have the option to use a competitive bid process in which price is the sole determinant, they have decided not to use this procurement option.

Each of the options has advantages and disadvantages. The Counties anticipate that the option will be selected that best matches the service delivery needs of each zone and helps to maintain healthy competition in the private sector.

The Counties anticipate that there will be standard contract terms for each type of service that will be modified to fit the specific needs of the zone.

7.5 Funding/Payment Methods

7.5.1 Objectives

The Counties have objectives related to funding as part of Public Collection. These include:

- ◆ Providing incentives for waste reduction and recycling by having the full cost of collection and disposal paid by users on their garbage bill;
- ◆ Removing some or all waste management service charge funding from the property tax statements; and
- ◆ A desire to avoid having a different tipping fee at a facility for the same hauler (i.e., a different rate for residential MSW versus commercial MSW).

7.5.2 Variables Affecting Funding

There are many characteristics that require flexibility in how public collection may be implemented. Therefore, the funding and payment system should be able to accommodate the variables. Some of the known variables include:

- ◆ Different zones with different contractors
- ◆ Different waste sources (residential vs. commercial) with different service delivery needs
- ◆ Different waste types (e.g., MSW, recyclables, yard waste, bulky waste, etc.)
- ◆ Covering some services in the base cost while others are optional
- ◆ Single-hauler zones and multiple-hauler zones
- ◆ Managing wastes at different facilities with different tipping fees (e.g., waste- to-energy or composting or landfilling)
- ◆ Accommodating continuation of existing municipal payment systems
- ◆ Potentially generating revenue for other county solid waste programs or services such as:
 - Municipal clean-ups
 - HHW collection and management
 - Illegal dumping clean-up and enforcement

In addition, several of the concerns noted in Section 6 and the problem with recycling noted in Section 5 are related to the lack of funding for recycling (particularly in commercial wastes and open hauling systems) or the lack of financial incentives for recycling and waste reduction. For discussion purposes in this preliminary framework, one potential approach to this would be a Resource Management Incentive. Conceptually, the Counties could include a Resource

Management Fee on invoices and use the revenue generated to rebate money to haulers based upon their recycling performance with their customers.

7.5.3 Billing Methods

There are three billing methods currently used, or potentially available, with each method having different potential variations. The three methods include:

- ◆ Hauler bills
- ◆ Municipal bills
- ◆ County bills
 - Property tax statements
 - Third party

As noted, one of the Counties' objectives is to discontinue use of the property tax statement as a billing tool for service charges. Therefore, this method is not preferred. Also, municipal bills is only used in some areas of the counties and is not available county wide.

As noted, there are many variables to address in any funding/billing approach. To simplify the concepts, the variables can be arranged in three groupings, including:

- ◆ Residential versus commercial
- ◆ Collection versus management (i.e., processing and disposal)
- ◆ Base services versus optional services or features

For residential services, the bills would cover the volume-based fees for MSW as well as any recycling service. In some zones, base residential collection service could also include yard wastes and bulky wastes. The residential base service would also include payment for the appropriate management method (i.e., processing or disposal) and could include billing for revenue for other county solid waste services (municipal clean-ups, illegal dumping clean-up and enforcement, and HHW services). In some zones, collection of yard wastes, bulky wastes, and brush will be optional services and therefore will be itemized as such on invoices.

For commercial services, the bills would cover the container rent (dumpster or roll-off) and the service level (number of stops or pulls per month). The commercial base would also include the management costs (processing and/or disposal). The bill could include pro-rated charges for other county services such as municipal clean-ups and illegal dumping clean-up and enforcement. The Resource Management Fee could also be included.

In all cases, the appropriate taxes will need to be applied to the bills.

7.5.3.1 Third-Party Billing

One option for billing is for the Counties to contract with an independent third party to handle the invoicing and payout functions.

Each hauler would submit the information required for invoicing (customer list, service levels, rates, etc.) to the third party on a regular basis. The Counties would supply information on county program costs. The third party would also receive hauler tonnage delivery reports from management facilities (processing/disposal) to use as a check against hauler invoice totals. The third party would send invoices on behalf of the county to the customers and receive payment. The third party would distribute payment to the hauler on behalf of the county for their service, to the Counties for their programs, and keep their internal administrative fee. In this approach, either the third party or the hauler could pay the management facilities.

This approach could be flexible enough to include the specific hauler’s name, address, and telephone number so that the hauler maintains identify with the customer and is the first contact for the customer for questions on service or billing.

7.5.3.2 Hauler Collected Service Charge

As an alternative to an independent third party, the Counties could use a Hauler Collected Service Charge (HCSC). This is a funding tool that could be implemented similarly to the method used by the Western Lake Superior Sanitary District (WLSSD), which the Minnesota Supreme Court indicated could be a model for other counties.

The hauler would continue to bill their customers and include line items for the county service charges along with the charges the hauler has for service. Table 4 summarizes the breakdown for residential service. Table 5 summarizes the breakdown for commercial service. The county service charge would need to establish charges for the respective management (processing and disposal) facilities on a volume-to-weight basis (similar to WLSSD). Alternatively, the full tipping fee could be charged directly to the waste haulers and then the management costs would switch to the hauler’s portion of the bill.

Key aspects of this HCSC approach could include:

- ◆ Haulers continue billing relationships with customers, with payments continued to be made to hauler.
- ◆ Hauler would send payment to county or county's agent for the county services and management. The hauler would retain the portion due the hauler for collection services provided according to the hauler's contract with the county.

8. Facilities

Under Public Collection, the counties would have potential increased exposure to liability associated with the solid wastes for which they arrange service. The Counties would need to take appropriate measures to manage this increased exposure. Delivery of the various wastes, including MSW, recyclables, yard waste, source-separated organics, brush, etc. would be to facilities meeting performance standards established by the counties.

As noted, the Counties anticipate Public/Private Partnerships in this process. There are several facilities (resource recovery, recycling facilities, yard waste, and sanitary landfills) in place that should be capable of providing part of the management services. The Counties would contract for *access* to these facilities that meet the performance requirements (i.e., standards related to percentage recovered versus residues as well as meeting all environmental regulatory requirements to minimize liability).

The contracts could provide for access to the facilities at a guaranteed price, but likely would not guarantee tonnage or minimum revenues (i.e., no "put-or-pay" requirements). If, and only if, the market does not respond to specifically provide the necessary facilities in a cost-competitive manner, the Counties could facilitate the development of the necessary management capacity. The Counties prefer any additional management facility development be coordinated at the regional level.

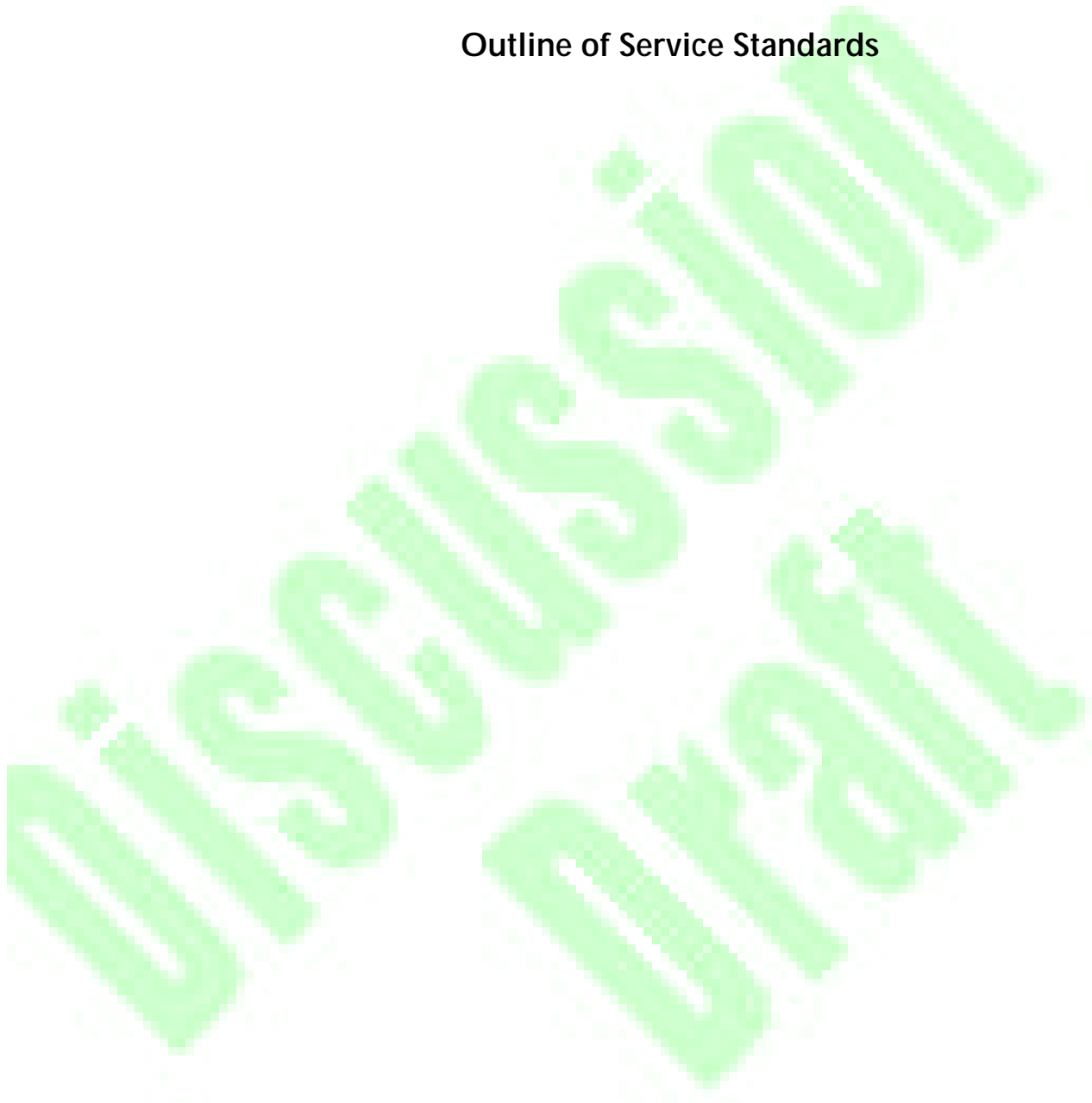
9. Draft Potential Approaches to Municipalities

Based on comments received during the study process to date and the need to accommodate existing municipal contracts, the preliminary framework is structured on a municipality-by-municipality basis. Appendix B contains a preliminary profile for each municipality in each county. The profiles contain information obtained to date on existing conditions, any potential preferences obtained from municipal officials, and preliminary options to consider for discussion. The profiles are in preliminary draft form with some information not yet available. The Counties anticipate the profiles will generate additional discussion and provide more extensive input in the next several weeks.

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Appendix A

Outline of Service Standards



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Draft List of Service Standards for Public Collection

This is an outline of service standards that could be included in any implementation of public collection. These standards are the expectations for various services. In some cases these would be included in ordinance, in others in vendor contracts.

This is a draft for discussion purposes. No decisions have been made.

I. Specific Collection Service Standards

A. Residential Garbage (MSW) Service (Generally refers to housing that is single-family, duplex, tri-plex, four-plex, but not “multifamily”)

1. Residential MSW

- Municipalities that currently contract for collection of MSW for some or all of their residents would be expected to continue providing such service, provided that the standards in this section are complied with by the next opportunity the municipality has to contract with hauler(s). Municipalities that currently contract could transfer to the County such service, either by assignment of the current contract, or at the next opportunity for contracting.
- All other municipalities would be allowed to develop a contract for refuse collection in accordance with the appropriate statutory process, provided that this process is completed in a timely manner, and that those contracts incorporate these service standards.
- Hours of collection shall comply with municipal service ordinances.
- MSW Collection service shall be provided weekly to all households, with the exception listed in the next bullet.
- Every household is required to have service, with some defined exemptions
 - A household may be exempted if the household ensures that an environmentally sound alternative is used, and as long as the alternative does not create a public health nuisance. Environmentally sound alternatives include doubling up with neighbors, self-hauling (to the same types of facilities that haulers use, or to transfer stations service such facilities), or having service less frequently than weekly (as authorized by municipal ordinance).
- Service shall be available on a volume-basis, as defined in ordinance. This service shall include a “very-low” volume option, such as a 20-gallon or smaller option.

- Source separated organics collection may be part of service in some zones. Organics in this case means food waste, non-recyclable paper products, and other materials that can be managed by composting.
- In certain areas residents will be asked to separate organic materials into color-coded bags, which will be disposed with other MSW or with recyclables (see recycling standards). Haulers in these zones will deliver the loads to facilities that separate the source-separated organic materials from the MSW and compost the organic materials, and which deliver the residual MSW to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility.
- In areas where MSW is not combined with source separated organic materials, the MSW shall be delivered to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility or to other facilities that may be specified by the County.
- **[Note: this is presented here, but may be more appropriate as a recycling service standard.]** MSW collection provided by haulers must include these materials (not required to be weekly collection; can be either by appointment or collection at a certain frequency, such as quarterly, etc)
 - Spent Lead Acid Batteries;
 - Used motor oil;
 - Used oil filters;
 - Televisions sets and computer monitors; and
 - Propane tanks.

These materials must be separately collected and managed by recycling.
- Service quality expectations/features
 - Clean up around container
 - When a hauler provides carts, the carts must be clearly labeled with the name and phone number of the hauling company
 - Response to missed stops- within an amount of time to be specified, such as within 8 hours of notification]
 - Flexibility for more generation of occasional large volumes, a specified number of times per year
 - Bulky material accepted
 - Senior rates and vacation rates
 - Alley side, curbside, etc.
 - Walk up service for disabled and frail individuals

2. Residential Recycling

- Municipalities that currently contract for collection of recyclables for some or all of their residents would be expected to continue providing such service, provided that the standards in this section are complied with by the next opportunity the municipality has contract with

recycler(s). Municipalities that currently contract could transfer to the County such service, either by assignment of the current contract, or at the next opportunity for contracting.

- All other municipalities would be allowed to develop a contract for recycling collection in accordance with the appropriate statutory process, provided that this process is completed in a timely manner, and that those contracts incorporate these service standards.
- Municipalities are expected to continue to provide/assure service as outlined in the Master Plan; if they do not, the County would provide the service.
- SCORE funds would be provided to those municipalities that assure/provide service. SCORE agreements would contain the service standards. Cities that do not provide service would no longer receive SCORE funds, and the County will use the allocation to help pay for curbside recycling service in that municipality. In municipalities that do not provide recycling services to multifamily or MHP residents, Ramsey County will reduce the SCORE funded grant to the municipality by an amount proportionate to the population in that housing, and will apply those funds for providing that service. Some SCORE funds maybe available for public education/information activities.

Broad types of materials includes the following categories:

- Glass
- Metal
- Paper
- Plastic
- Other (such as textiles, source separated organic waste, problem materials)
- Curbside collection shall occur at least twice a month.
- Recycling collection should occur on the same day as MSW collection.
- Recycling services shall be made available in a manner convenient for disabled and fragile individuals.
- Small businesses can be offered curbside recycling service on residential routes if in close proximity to residential customers.
- Recyclables are to be managed as outlined below in the section labeled Recycling – Marketing.
- Service Quality Expectations
 - Clean up around container
 - Response to missed stops within – hours of notification
 - Leave card with rejected materials to explain about proper preparation, reason for rejection.

B. Commercial Service

1. Commercial MSW

- 1 yd dumpster minimum
- Hours of collection shall comply with municipal service ordinances.
- MSW Collection service shall be provided at a frequency established by the management of the commercial account, but shall be at least weekly.
- Service shall be available on a volume-basis.
- Source separated organics collection may be part of service. Organics in this case means food waste, non-recyclable paper products, and other materials that can be managed by composting.
- In certain areas businesses will be asked to separate organic materials into color-coded bags, which will be disposed with other MSW or perhaps with recyclables (see recycling standards) or perhaps in separate containers. Haulers in these zones will deliver the loads to facilities that separate the source-separated organic materials from the MSW and compost the organic materials, and which deliver the residual MSW to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility.
- In areas where MSW is not combined with source separated organic materials, the MSW shall be delivered to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility.
- Service quality expectations
 - Clean up around container
 - When a hauler provides containers, the containers must be clearly labeled with the name and phone number of the hauling company
 - Response to missed stops shall be within – hours of notification
 - Bulky material accepted

2. Commercial Recycling

- Recycling Service to be offered to all commercial customers by the MSW hauler. Note that in the residential services described above, small businesses can participate in residential recycling programs, or multi-family recycling programs.
- Minimum service to be offered includes these broad types of materials:
 - Glass
 - Metal
 - Paper – including office paper, mixed paper and OCC
 - Plastic
- Recycling service shall include an educational component that provides customers with information for employees about recycling services.

C. Multifamily Housing and Manufactured Home Park Service

1. Multi-family and MHP MSW

- Hours of collection shall comply with municipal service ordinances.
- MSW Collection service shall be provided at a frequency established by the management of the housing, but shall be at least weekly.
- Service shall be available on a volume-basis.
- Source separated organics collection may be part of service in some zones. Organics in this case means food waste, non-recyclable paper products, and other materials that can be managed by composting.
- In certain areas residents will be asked to separate organic materials into color-coded bags, which will be disposed with other MSW or perhaps with recyclables (see recycling standards). Haulers in these zones will deliver the loads to facilities that separate the source-separated organic materials from the MSW and compost the organic materials, and which deliver the residual MSW to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility.
- In areas where MSW is not combined with source separated organic materials, the MSW shall be delivered to either an RDF or Mass Burn type of resource recovery facility.
- MSW collection provided by haulers must include these materials (not required to be weekly collection; can be either by appointment or collection at a certain frequency, such as quarterly, etc) Spent Lead Acid Batteries; used motor oil; used oil filters; televisions sets and computer monitors; fluorescent lamps; propane tanks. These materials must be separately collected and managed by recycling.
- Service quality expectations
 - Clean up around container
 - When a hauler provides containers, the containers must be clearly labeled with the name and phone number of the hauling company
 - Response to missed stops shall occur within – hours of notification.
 - Bulky material accepted

2. Multi Family and MHP Recycling

- Municipalities that provide curbside recycling to residents are strongly encouraged to, as part of their service provision, offer multi-family housing recycling services to those residents.

- In municipalities that do not provide curbside recycling to residents, and in which the County provides that service, the County shall include multi-family housing in those services.
- In municipalities that do not provide recycling services to multifamily or MHP residents, Ramsey County will reduce the SCORE funded grant to the municipality by an amount proportionate to the population in that housing, and will apply those funds for providing that service.
- Minimum service to be offered includes these broad types of materials:
 - Glass
 - Metal
 - Paper
 - Plastic
 - Other (such as textiles, source separated organic waste, problem materials)
- Hauler shall provide containers at a central place in which residents may place materials for recycling.
- Service quality expectations
 - Clean up around container
 - When a hauler provides carts, the carts must be clearly labeled with the name and phone number of the hauling company

D. Recycling - Marketing

- Materials separated and collected for recycling must be taken directly to markets to a materials processing facility. (Minn. Stat. Section 115A.553)
- If materials separated and collected for recycling are taken to a materials processing facility, that facility shall have a residue generation rate that does not exceed a specified percentage of the recyclables received for processing, as calculated on an rolling twelve month average basis.
- Materials separated for recycling should, to the greatest extent possible, be taken to end-markets that remanufacture the materials into a form that can again be recycled. Examples are glass bottles to glass bottles; aluminum cans to aluminum cans; newspaper to newspaper; newspaper to boxboard. These markets are preferred over markets that remanufacture the materials into a product that has a single use. Examples of these types of markets are newspaper to animal bedding; glass to roadbed material; glass to landfill cover.

II. Other Service Standards

A. Residential Toxicity Reduction

- Counties will continue to have contracts with HHW vendors to provide HHW collection
- Counties will provide convenient drop-off service for HHW

- Counties will incorporate HHW into certain clean-up events
- Counties will develop curbside HHW collection services in their HHW Vendor contracts for certain classes of generators, such as shut-ins, elderly on a subscription basis.
- Counties may develop a pilot study on curbside collection of HHW.
- MSW Collectors for residential and multifamily housing will be required to provide periodic collection service for these materials:
 - Spent Lead Acid Batteries;
 - Used motor oil; used oil filters;
 - Televisions sets and computer monitors;
 - Fluorescent lamps; and
 - Propane tanks.

B. Bulky Wastes

- Types of problem materials included in this are:
 - Tires,
 - Furniture,
 - Carpeting,
 - Structural lumber,
 - Treated wood,
 - Metals (bicycle frames, etc),
 - Gas powered engines,
 - Plumbing fixtures,
 - Remodeling wastes,
 - Asbestos wastes,
 - Tree and shrub waste,
 - Mattresses.
- Contracts with residential waste haulers will require that service be provided to collect these materials. Two options for payment
 - Fee for service
 - Included in overall contract price (Stillwater model)
- Counties will assure, through contracts with municipalities or directly with haulers, convenient regular community clean up events for problem materials and other wastes.

C. Yard Waste/Organics/Tree Waste

- Yard waste collection service is currently provided by private subscription service (haulers or lawn service firms) or by community collection sites
- Yard waste collection service will continue to be available in an array of services, with some changes
 - Ramsey County will continue to operate yard waste sites for residents, but may change operations to be transfer only at all sites, depending on

issues related to specific sites, space, cost, etc. Ramsey County will likely not attempt to replace existing sites should they be closed.

- Washington County will continue to rely on municipalities to provide collection sites, and will rely on those communities to decide whether or not drop off service is to continue
- MSW haulers will be required to provide yard waste collection services. This may be either on a fee basis, or included in the overall contract
- In those areas where there is collection of source separated organic materials, yard waste may be co-collected with organic waste.
- Collection of tree and shrub waste from routine yard maintenance will be a required service by MSW collectors. Collection will also be available at clean up events.
- Tree waste resulting from natural or human caused disasters is addressed in county emergency disaster plans and this is normally a municipality level response, with disaster funds paying for clean up. This would remain unchanged, with public collection addressing routine collection of material.

Appendix B

Profile for Each Municipality in County

Foreward

Introduction

Appendix B contains a preliminary profile for each municipality in the county. The profiles contain information obtained to date on the existing conditions in each municipality for several types of solid wastes. Any potential preference obtained from municipal officials to date is listed along with preliminary options to consider for discussion. The profiles are in preliminary draft form with some information not yet available. In some instances, the existing system information shown could be incomplete or inaccurate. The data was pulled from readily available, pre-existing records. The Counties greatly appreciate receiving input that will make the data more accurate or complete.

Frequently Used Terms

“Open” refers to existing collection systems that are not contracted to a specific company.

“Organized” means the service is provided under contract by a single company.

“Optional Service” is generally used with bulky wastes, brush, or yard waste to indicate that customers would purchase these services as extras from their hauler.

“Base Service” used with bulky wastes, brush, or yard waste means that these services are included in the base monthly cost and are not charged extra.

Potential Options

For many municipalities there is a column “A” option and a Column “B” option with differences among some of the services. For example, Option A could be to “stay the same” for solid waste collection. Option B could be change the number of haulers. Some of the services such as yard wastes, brush, or bulky wastes have the same approach listed in both options. **IT IS IMPORTANT TO NOTE, OPTIONS ARE FOR DISCUSSION PURPOSES ONLY.** There could be blends of one option with another to best suit the needs and preferences of each municipality. The Counties desire to obtain input from municipalities and the listing of options is solely to generate discussion and determine preferences.
