

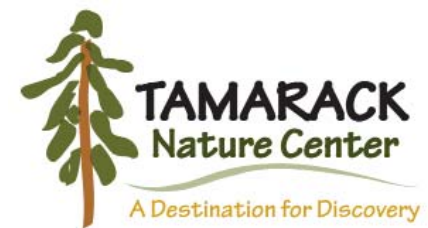

About Tamarack Nature Center

Tamarack Nature Center is a 320-acre Ramsey County nature preserve located within Bald Eagle - Otter Lake Regional Park in White Bear Township, MN. Tamarack Nature Center is dedicated to increasing awareness and understanding of our natural resources for future generations. We provide opportunities for outdoor recreation in a natural setting as well as quality environmental education experiences. The park contains extensive woodlands, wetlands and restored prairies for exploration.

Scheduling Process

Programs are instructed by professional environmental educators. Call (651) 407-5350 to schedule a program for your troop. Please have tentative dates and times in mind. A minimum of 6 weeks advance reservation is recommended, as space is limited. Programs cannot be scheduled less than two weeks prior to programming date. Every effort will be made to accommodate your needs.

Fees

- Program Rate: \$78 minimum for up to 12 scouts
- Additional students: \$6.50/scout
- Equipment Rental (ski and snowshoe): \$5/person with program

The full program fee is due at least 30 days prior to your program date. Check, cash, Visa, MasterCard and Discover are accepted.

Fee does not include special materials or equipment rental. Additional fees will be noted if required.

Cancellations and Refunds

Tamarack Nature Center will refund the program fee, minus a \$25.00 processing fee, for cancellations at least 30 days prior to the date of program. Refunds can't be made if cancelled less than 30 days prior to program.

Weather Policy

Nature doesn't stop when it rains and neither do we! Some of our best memories are shared during those unexpected moments. Please dress appropriately for the weather.

Recreational Programs

Orienteering

Offered Year Round

Learn the basics of the adventurous sport of orienteering. Use a map, compass and pacing to "orienteer" your way around Tamarack.

Snowshoe Tracks

Offered December - February

Strap on a pair of snowshoes and explore the winter woods, lake and marsh. A naturalist will show you the secrets of the winter creatures and teach you how to use the "big feet."

Optional \$5/person snowshoe rental

Nordic Ski Basics

Offered December - February

Step, kick and slide through the snow and have lots of skiing fun. A ski instructor will teach you the basics then review techniques through games and activities.

Optional \$5/person ski rental

Group Ski Rental

Offered December - February

Bring your group in to try their hand at skiing. Use classroom 1/2 hour before or after rental for other group activities. Make request when booking. If available, a naturalist will give a brief introduction on proper cross-country ski form before you hit the trails. Minimum group size of 12 to take advantage of this program. Fee: \$10/person for 2 hour rental

Service Learning

Tamarack Nature Center welcomes groups wishing to assist with trail maintenance, habitat restoration and monitoring projects. Contact the center for more projects and information.

Cadette Badge Programs

All About Birds

Offered Year Round

Tamarack Nature Center is a great place to observe birds, both in their natural habitat and as preserved specimens. Girls learn to identify birds using a field guide, binoculars and their own field notes. They hike to observe bird behavior and song. Experiments allow them to test aerodynamic principles. Take the first steps toward becoming a bird expert! Each scout should bring a small notebook, binoculars and field guides if available. Completes Skill Builders 1, 2 & 3, partially completes Technology 1

Note: Public bird banding demonstrations are scheduled in spring. Call the nature center for more information. This activity completes Technology 2.

Wildlife

Offered Fall and Spring

Explore a study site at Tamarack to identify local plants and wildlife. Participate in a discussion on wildlife hazards and evaluate your "at home" practices to see what you can do to help. This program completes Skill Builders 1, 2, and 3, Service Project 4 and partially completes Skill Builders 4. Scouts will need to complete three activities on their own.

Discovery Kits

Offered Year Round

Tamarack Discovery Kits are available for your use year round! Use the kit to facilitate a nature hike activity with your group. Kits include activity ideas, hand lenses, paper, crayons, bug boxes, thermometers and child-size binoculars. Large groups may use more than one kit. Kits are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Fee: A small donation will be accepted for the use of the Discovery Kit, and you will also be asked to leave an item of value as collateral while it is in use (driver's license or a set of keys).

Except for cross-country ski and snowshoe classes, which require 8-10 inches of snowfall, Tamarack Nature Center usually does not cancel classes due to weather. Staff will modify a program as needed to keep children safe in stormy, icy or extremely cold weather.

Scout Badge Programs

Programs are designed to provide scouts with specialized natural history knowledge and hands-on experiences, but do not necessarily complete each badge. Often scouts need to do follow-up research or write about their experience. We suggest that all leaders have a review session at a future meeting to reinforce the badge requirements.

Chaperones

Tamarack requires at least two adult chaperones per group of 12 scouts; we do not charge a program fee for chaperones although equipment rental fees will apply.

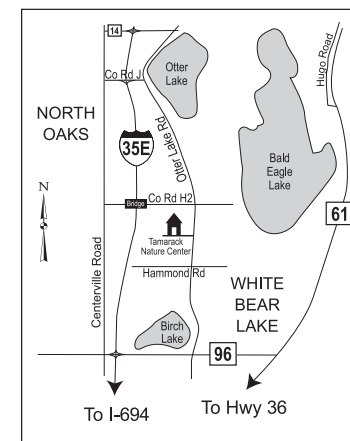

Brownie Badge Programs

The following Brownie Try-its are offered year round, unless otherwise indicated. Programs are 2 hours in length.

Earth and Sky

Explore the earth beneath your feet and the sky over your head for signs of life. Experiment with erosion, rocks and/or sunlight. (Activities vary with the weather and may include 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 or 6)

Eco-Explorer

Use your senses as you go on a nature scavenger hunt! Explore animal habitats and find out what animals eat at Tamarack. Discover out what you can do to help wildlife at Tamarack Nature Center or at home. (Activities 1, 2, 4 and 6)

Watching Wildlife

What makes that animal special? Adaptations! Take a close look at some Tamarack animals, explore their homes and discover what “makes them tick”! Go for a hike to see how wild animals find their food and shelter. (Activities may include 1, 2, 3, 4 or 5 plus animals 2 or 4)

Pond Study Kit

Fee: \$10/group

Do your own pond study in Tamarack Lake to satisfy requirement 8 of Water Fun (Junior) or requirement 5 of Water Everywhere (Brownie). A Pond Study Kit includes dippers, dish tubs, aquatic nets and pond field guides. A naturalist will give you a brief introduction on how to use the equipment to find and identify water critters. Replacement fees will apply for lost equipment. Dock capacity limited to 15/scouts and chaperones. Offered: Fall and Spring (Please call to reserve a time slot. Equipment is limited).

Junior Badge Programs

Earth Connections

Offered Fall and Spring

Juniors can improve their ecological observation skills with this program. Scouts will collect data, create a food chain and learn about succession in a study site at Tamarack. Scouts will also learn a habitat game that they can teach to another troop. (Activities may include 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 7 or 8).

Frosty Fun Badge

Offered December through February

Learn how to stay safe outdoors in Minnesota in the winter, and find out how our animal neighbors survive. Then become a nature detective as you hike to look for animal tracks and signs. Troops should complete Activity #1 before their visit. (Activities may include: 5, 6, 8, 10)

If snow conditions permit, snowshoeing may be included. (Activity 9)

Optional Snowshoe Rental Fee: \$5/person with program

Wildlife

Offered Fall and Spring

Here's your chance to “eat like a bird”, find out what makes animals unique, take a close look at wildlife and draw a picture of your observations. Learn about wildlife dangers, as well as endangered wildlife in Minnesota and hike to test your ID skills. (May include requirements 1, 2, 3, 5, 6, 7, 8) (9 by special request)

Rocks Rock

A rock, is a rock, is a rock. You might think so, but you'd be surprised! Discover different types of rocks and how they are formed and search the nature center for clues of geological events. Scouts will also investigate soil in depth, discover how fossils are formed and take a peek at some aerial photos. This program will cover activities 2-4, 8 and 9.

Sky Search/Starry Skies

Discover the wonder of a starry night and hear stories about the stars from around the world. Make and use a star finder, a mini star viewer and learn how a telescope works. Learn about the moon and why it changes phases. Then use your new skills outside under the starry skies! Program will continue, rain or shine, so dress for the weather. Please bring a grocery bag to carry troop projects home. Binoculars are useful if available.
