Immediately thereafter, all bids will be opened publicly and read aloud in the City Hall/Court House, 15 West Kellogg Boulevard, St. Paul, Minnesota.

Bidding documents, including the Drawings and Specifications will be on file at the Division of Contract and Analysis Services, Room 280, City Hall/Court House, 15 West Kellogg Boulevard, St. Paul, Minnesota 55102.
