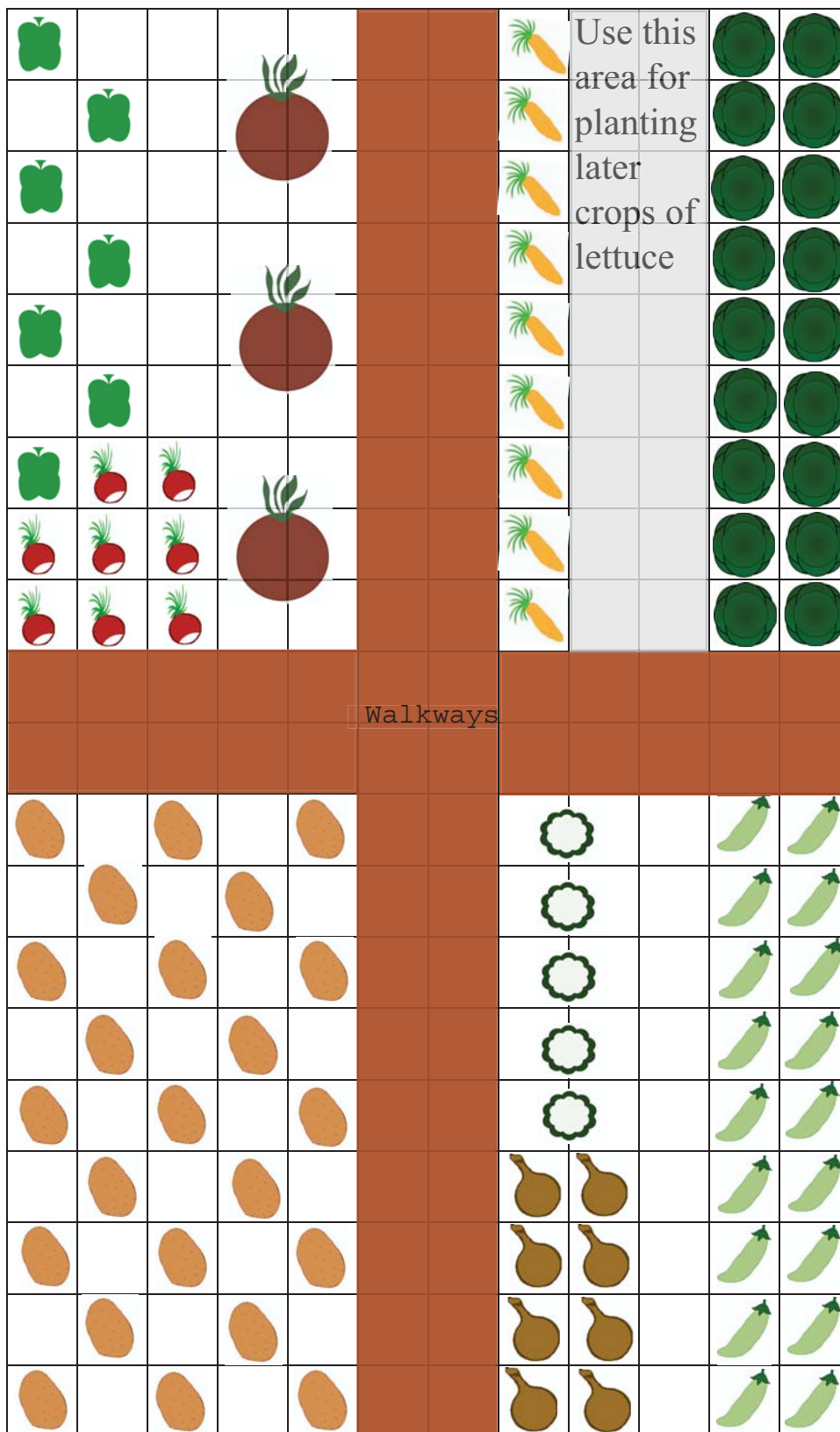


General Garden Sample Layout 3

Each square equals 1-square foot

Sample Bed is 12 feet by 20 feet



Commonly seeded directly outdoors:

- Beans
- Carrots
- Corn
- Cucumbers
- Lettuce
- Peas
- Squash
- Watermelon

Commonly planted as plants (transplants)/bulbs or start seeds indoors:

- Herbs
- Garlic
- Onions
- Tomatoes
- Peppers



Tomatoes come in determinate (they stop growing) and indeterminate (they grow all season long) types. Determinates take up less room and include patio varieties. Basically, a tomatoes will require about 9 square feet per plant unless trellised. For trellised plants, plant every 4 feet.



Peppers need about 1 square feet per plant. Can plant started plants or start seeds indoors.



Potatoes need about 1 square feet per plant. Can be started from tubers that are certified as disease free.



Carrots can be planted about 12 per square foot. Plant seeds directly outside.



Onions and garlic can be planted 12 per square foot. Can plant bulbs, transplants, or start seed indoors.



Lettuce can be planted about 9 per square foot (for leaf lettuce). Directly seed outside as soon as the soil can be worked. Likes cool soil.



Broccoli, Cabbage, or Cauliflower planted about 1 plant per 1 to 2 square feet. Start indoors. Likes cool soil and will benefit from a floating row cover).



Peas and beans can be planted about 8 per square foot. Seed directly outdoors. Peas like cool weather and plants that vine can be trellised.



Radishes can be planted about 12-16 per foot. Seed directly outdoors. Likes cool weather. Additional plantings can be done every two weeks.
